series on the metric system.

Adjusting home food preparaprobably cause little trouble, says Louise Young, consumer economics specialist at the University of Wisconsin. "Actually, after you become acquainted with the system, it probably will be easier to use. Measurements are based on tens rather than the complicated pound-ounces and cup-tablespoon-teaspoon measurements," she comments.

Today, the standard measuring cup is equivalent to 236.6 milliliters. If the change to the metric system is made, an agreement would need to be made on the standard cup as a fraction of the liter — perhaps 250 milliliters. This would be \(\frac{1}{4} \)

Then, if the teaspoon relationship to the cup remains the familiar 16 to 1 ratio, favorite recipes can still be used.

The product would be a little large but the ingredient proportions would remain the same.
