## Her Song's A Success, But Writer Is Missing

Milwaukee—(UP)—A little black disc with the gravelly voice of "Rochester" sat in New York today waiting to spin out shiny dollars for two musicians but only one was available to start it. Harry Halloway, Milwaukee attorney, asked for help in locating Shirley Mhore, a Negro singer, who wrote the music for "Oh! Boy What A Girl."

A New York record company wants Miss Mhore and William H. Mosby, 27, who composed the lyrics, to sign a contract so the firm can distribute the song. Eddie Anderson, Jack Benny's "Rochester," recorded it.

Mosby said here he had the song copyrighted in 1943. He and Miss Mhore collaborated on it earlier, and while Mosby was in the service he contacted "Rochester."

Mosby said the Negro comedian liked the song but suggested some changes which were made by two New York collaborators. Then it was recorded.

Miss Mhore, who helped write the song here, recently left town presumably to go to New York. Halloway said there was no trace of her.

Detectives and relatives of the girl were unable to provide any leads. Meanwhile, Mosby was holding the bag to catch the dollars that only Miss Mhore could send shooting out of the little black disc.

## Plan Huge Music Festival For 1948 State Centennial

Madison, Wis.—(UP)—Plans for a Wisconsin-wide series of music festivals, developing into the largest single music event ever held in the state were revealed today by the State Centennial Executive committee.

The music festivities for the centennial year will be climaxed with a gigantic two-night production by the state's best musicians at the Centennial exposition at Milwaukee Aug. 25 and 26.

Mrs. Ronald A. Dougan, Beloit general chairman, already has formed a statewide organization to obtain the best talent from every small community in the state to appear in sectional and regional festivals. The choice of these groups will appear in the grand final event at Milwaukee the committee said.

The centennial music activities are divided into two groups—adult and the high school festival for all public and parochial schools in the state.

Talent for the adult event will be selected by bringing together the best groups and individuals of each district in the state into a regional festival. The youth and high school talent will be selected from winning bands, orchestras, and choruses of the high school tournaments and other school events throughout the state.

The committee also revealed that more than 2,800 churches in the state have been contacted and all faiths invited to participate in four church music festivals during 1948.

Another feature of the celebration will be the annual convention in Milwaukee of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barbershop Quartet Singing in America.

Washington—(UP)—Housing Expediter Frank R. Creedon, acting for the first time under the new rent control law today approved a 5 per cent rent increase for the Louisville, Ky., area.

Creedon also ordered continuation of existing controls and rent ceilings in four other areas and approved removal of rent controls in Lawrence county, S. D., with the exception of the city of Spearfish.

In each case, Creedon acted on recommendations of local rent advisory boards set up under the rent control extension act which became effective last July 1.
