A New York record company wants Miss Mhore and William H Mosby, 27, who composed the lyrics, to sign a contract so the firm can distribute the song Eddie Anderson, Jack Benny's "Rochester." recorded it

Mosby said here he had the song copyrighted in 1943 He and Miss Mhore collaborated on it earlier, and while Moshy was in the service he contacted 'Rochester"

Mosby said the Negro comedian liked the song but suggested some changes which were made by two New York collaborators Then it was recorded

Miss Mhore, who helped write the song here, recently left town presumably to go to New York Halloway said there was Detectives and relatives of the girl were unable to provide

Meanwhile, Mosby was holding the bag to catch the dollars that only Miss Mhore could send shooting out of the little black disc


