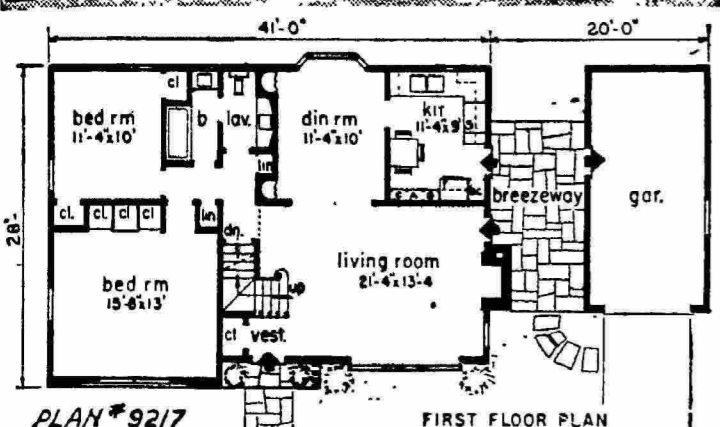

A luxury plan for an economical small house, this design 9217 by Herman York, architect, 115 New Hyde Park Rd., Garden City, N. Y., includes a full basement and an expansion attic for the addition of extra bedrooms. An open stairway with landing creates a front vestibule with coat closet. Breezeway porch opens from both living room and kitchen. Bathroom is divided and equipped with two washstands, one with vanity counter. Eight closets on the first floor include two linen closets, one for towels and one for bedding. Dining room has two built-in china cupboards. Fireplace at the end of the long living room permits comfortable furniture grouping. The house covers only about 1,090 square feet without breezeway and garage.

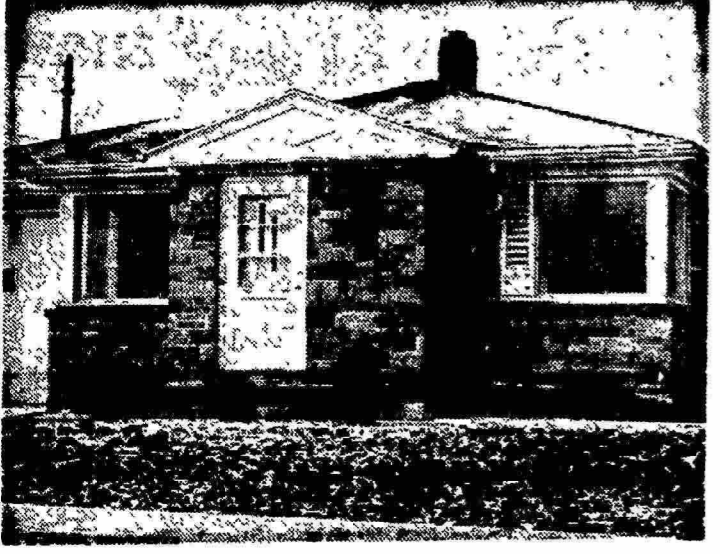
